GENERAL RULES

- Please note entries will <u>only</u> be accepted on the digital competition entry form and must be submitted to the County Office by the set date.
- 2. Clubs may enter the total number of entrants, please note that competitors over the age of 28 will not be able to compete at Eastern Area and National competitions and that only one entry will count towards points.
- 3. Provided a club has already submitted their current block entry, they may request to the Competitions & Training Committee (CAT) Chairman a late entry into competitions for that block. Acceptance of a late entry is at the discretion of the CAT Chairman and Vice-Chairman and will not be permitted where this will detrimentally affect the running of the competition.
- 4. Change of entries will **NOT** be accepted later than 3 working days prior to a weekend competition, and 5 working days for a weekday/evening competition; changes on the day may lead to disqualification. Late withdrawals from any competition, changes on the day or lack of attendance will issue a £40.00 fine which will be invoiced to the club, this will be reduced to £20.00 if paid within 7 days. **No show or Late Withdrawal from any competition will also result in 3 marks being deducted from the NFU Trophy score of the Club.**
- 5. All competition rules will be strictly enforced and if any Clubs are found to be in default after an event, their results will be discounted and any NFU Cup Points gained will be deducted. Clubs are asked to be particularly aware of the age qualifications for competitors in each individual competition. These are clearly laid down in each set of both County and National

- rules. If you require clarification of any rules please refer to the CAT Chairman, Vice-Chairman or the YFC Office. National rules and guidelines will be in place for all National competitions.
- 6. COMPETITORS MUST BE REGISTERED MEMBERS. Members must produce a digital membership card with a photograph. Where a membership card cannot be shown digitally it must be printed. If no card is presented (either digital or printed) then the member will not be allowed to compete.
- 7. Insurance. The cover provided by the National YFC Insurance Scheme will apply to all Clubs and members participating in any of these competitions. Any queries regarding Insurance, contact the County Office in the first instance. Non-members competing where not agreed prior to the competition with the County Office will invalidate the competition's insurance for the entire day.
- 8. If, at the time of the competition day, a club holds an overdue invoice owed to Norfolk FYFC the club will not be able to compete until the invoice is paid in full. This is in line to the Constitution.
- 9. Selection of competitors for Eastern Area/National Competitions will be organised on competition days if possible.
- 10. If there are not enough entries received for any individual competition, the competition will not take place.
- II. A "SCRATCH TEAM" is permitted. The team cannot be placed but will gain I point for entering.

Countrysiders cannot join until their 10th birthday

JUNIOR Member must be 10 – 16 as at 1st September 2023

1. DATE AND VENUE

1.1. After Area Finals, the National Final will be held on Competitions Day, Saturday 6th July 2024 at Staffordshire Showground.

2. **REPRESENTATION**

- 2.1. Counties may enter one team per 600 members or part thereof in Area Finals.
- 2.2. Areas will be represented in the final by one team per 3,000 members or part thereof. (Northern Area 2, Eastern Area 1 and East Midlands 1, West Midlands Area 1, South West Area 2, South East Area 1 and Wales 2)

3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1. A team shall consist of **three (3)** members, each of whom must be 14 years of age or under on 1st September 2023 and full members of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC.

4. SUBSTITUTION

4.1. All substitutes must have been eligible to compete in the County Final.

5. PROCEDURE

- 5.1. The title of the book (including ISBN number) to be used will be notified to each team three weeks prior to the day of the competition Final.
- 5.2. The team of three members will be required to read aloud a passage selected and provided by the Judge, in English and in front of an audience.
- 5.3. The passages to be read will be given to finalists by the Chief Steward on the day of the final.
- 5.4. A draw will be made for the order of appearance prior to the competition.
- 5.5. All teams will be held in the preparation room until it is their turn to compete to avoid an unfair advantage as all teams are reading the same text. Therefore, competitors and their trainer will not be allowed into the room where the competition is taking place before competing.
- 5.6. Competitors have the choice to read from the book or from the card provided or from an electronic device such as a Kindle supplied by the competitor.
- 5.7. The Chairmen to introduce the team and give a brief background about the book.
- 5.8. Each member of the team (including the Chairman) will be required to read a different passage from the book, but each team will read the same set of passages as the other teams.

- 5.9. Teams will be given 30 minutes before they compete to read through the passages with their trainer in the preparation room.
 - 5.9.1.1. Members may read through their given passages in the preparation room.
 - 5.9.1.2. Books are allowed in the preparation room beforehand.
 - 5.9.1.3. One Trainer per team is allowed into the preparation room.
 - 5.9.1.4. Teams will be penalised for using distasteful jokes or bad language. Teams are reminded that this is a Public Speaking Competition and marks are awarded for speeches characters to the extreme will be penalised. Judges reserve the right to disqualify teams/members they perceive to be offensive or discriminatory.

1. DATE AND VENUE

1.1. After Area Finals, the National Final will be held on Competitions Day, Saturday 6th July 2024 at Staffordshire Showground.

2. REPRESENTATION

- 2.1. Counties may enter one team per 600 members or part thereof in Area Finals.
- 2.2. Areas will be represented in the final by one team per 3,000 members or part thereof. (Northern Area 2, Eastern Area 1 and East Midlands 1, West Midlands Area 1, South West Area 2, South East Area 1 and Wales 2).

3. **ELIGIBILITY**

3.1. A team shall consist of **three (3)** members, each of whom must be 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2023 and full members of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC.

4. SUBSTITUTION

4.1. All substitutes must have been eligible to compete in the County Final.

PROCEDURE

- 5.1. The team shall consist of a Chairman, Speaker and Proposer of the Vote of Thanks. Competitors before and after competing may be admitted to the Competition Room.
- 5.2. The procedure will follow that of a normal meeting.
- 5.3. Fifteen minutes (15) before his or her team is due to compete; the Chairmen will be introduced to the speaker.
 - 5.3.1. The Speaker will provide written notes giving the subject chosen and personal background (e.g. school, special interests, YFC membership, Club Offices held, activities within the Club, etc.). These notes to be handed to the Chief Steward at the beginning of the competition and will be **available** for the Chairman and Judges. To note that Power Point may be used as a visual aid for the Speaker, but they are not to be used for the whole speech and can only be used to enhance the speech. I.e. this is **NOT** a business presentation competition.
 - 5.3.2. The Speaker, who will be the guest of another team, will choose his/her own subject. The Speaker will then answer a question put by the Proposer of Vote of thanks and then a question from the judging panel. There is to be no questions asked from the floor/audience. A total of two questions will be asked.
 - 5.3.3. The chairman will invite the judges to put one question to the speaker who will then respond.

- 5.3.4. The Proposer will be seated in the body of the hall. He/she will take up some point in the Speaker's address, comment, agree or disagree and ask one pertinent question on the subject matter of the address. He/she will give the Vote of Thanks to the Speaker after all questions have been dealt with.
- 5.4. No communication, written or verbal between any of the team members, or the audience, will be permitted, and to do so will result in **immediate disqualification**.
- 5.5. Competitors may take notes FOR REFERENCE on to the platform as long as these notes are written on POSTCARDS. However, excessive, and obvious use of notes will be penalised. No other reference books or papers may be used by teams while on the platform, except for visual aids intended to add to the understanding of the subject by the audience.
- 5.6. Teams will be penalised for using distasteful jokes or bad language. Teams are reminded that this is a Public Speaking Competition and marks are awarded for speeches characters to the extreme will be penalised. Judges reserve the right to disqualify teams/members they perceive to be offensive or discriminatory.
- 5.7. Speakers are asked to be mindful of the topic chosen for their speeches as this is a junior competition.
- 6. NFYFC is an inclusive organisation that encourages and supports the participation of all our members. If you require any additional support or resources to participate effectively in any element of this competition, please contact the competitions department two weeks prior to the competition final to allow us to work with you so that specific arrangements can be made.

The Youth Forum works to improve the YFC membership for younger members by ensuring the voices and opinions of those members are heard and acted upon at a national level.

1. DATE AND VENUE

1.1. After Area Eliminators, the National Final will be held at Competitions weekend on Saturday, 6th July 2024 at the County Showground Stafford.

2. REPRESENTATION

- 2.1. Counties may enter one competitor per 600 members or part thereof in Area Eliminators.
- 2.2. Areas will be represented by <u>one</u> competitor in the Final competition. (Northern Area 1, Eastern Area 1 and East Midlands 1, West Midlands Area 1, South West Area 1, South East Area 1 and Wales 1)
- 2.3. Member of the Year (17 & under) competitors are eligible to compete in a second NFYFC final on the same day if applicable.

3. **ELIGIBILITY**

- 3.1. The competitor must be 17 years or under on 1st September 2023 and a full member of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC.
- 3.2. If the competitor through to the National Final must withdraw from the competition, then the next highest placed competitor will represent the Area.
- 3.3. All substitutes must have been eligible to compete in the County Final.

4. PROCEDURE

4.1. PART 1 – SYNOPSIS FORM

4.1.1. 28 DAYS prior to the National Final competitors will be required to submit to the Competitions Department at NFYFC a completed synopsis form (attached) to be no more than 2 sides of A4, detailing their YFC activities. It is recommended that this form be used at County and Area level. (Special emphasis should be placed on their involvement at Club level).

4.2. PART 2 - PRESENTATION & FORMAL INTERVIEW

4.2.1. The Competitor is requested to prepare a presentation using Microsoft power point software to include their experiences gained at YFC Club, County, Area, and National. They should also include activities outside of YFC.

- 4.2.2. The presentation should be based on experiences gained in the 12 months before the competition final. Competitors are therefore expected to build on the presentations they give at the Area round of the competition held earlier in the year.
- 4.2.3. This presentation is to complement your Synopsis Form
- 4.2.4. Timing no less than 3 and no more than 10 minutes.
- 4.2.5. The presentation will be made to the judges only.
- 4.2.6. On completion of the presentation judges will ask questions on the Synopsis Form, on the competitor's knowledge of YFC and/or current issues or news relating to young people.
- 5.4 At the NFYFC National Final a laptop and projector will be provided. Area Finals should organise and provide their own equipment.

4.1. At the NFYFC final, the Competitor will have one (1) hour to individually create a piece as described in the following Floral Art Schedules:

OVERALL THEME - CHRISTMAS

4.2. **16 & Under**

- 4.2.1. **Exhibit** Title: "**Table Decoration**" **Centre Piece -** should be viewed from all angles to the theme Christmas.
- 4.2.2. The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

- 4.2.3. Exhibit is to be viewed from all sides. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards MUST complement the theme and be neat and tidy.
- 4.2.4. At the national finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

4.3. **21 & Under**

- 4.3.1. Exhibit Title: "Door Wreath" A Front Facing Exhibit to the theme Christmas.
- 4.3.2. The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.
- 4.3.3. Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards MUST complement the theme and be neat and tidy.
- 4.3.4. At the national finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

4.4. **28 & Under**

- 4.4.1. **Exhibit** Title: "Bouquet" viewed from all sides to theme Christmas.
- 4.4.2. The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.
- 4.4.3. Exhibit is to be viewed from all sides no backboards allowed.
- 4.4.4. At the national finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

5. **DISPLAY**

- 5.1. A worktable will be provided close to the display area approx half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor.
- 5.2. Each exhibit will be displayed to their best advantage with the space allocation.
- 5.3. All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitors and must be assembled in the hall.
- 5.4. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards, under penalty of instant disqualification. No other person, other than the competitors, will be allowed in the competing area.
- 5.5. At the NFYFC final, the NFYFC will provide a County Name and Number label for each display and workspace.
- 5.6. Competitors may use a battery-operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will no mains power supply available
- 5.7. Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the back board or base board (i.e. the thickness of the backboard will be included in the size restrictions). Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the back board or base board will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit and should be within the size restrictions. The external side of the back board will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit.
- 5.8. Exhibits must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. Any entry removed before the Presentation of Awards will be disqualified.
- 5.9. All exhibits and competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and NFYFC cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value.

6. **TIMING**

- 6.0. Allowance of **one hour to include final checks and measurement of the exhibit**. Before leaving the competing area, competitors will be given a further 5 minutes to clear and tidy the work site.
- 6.1. Competitors may unpack their equipment and plant material/flowers onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session commences.
- 6.2. No floral foam is allowed Eco friendly alternatives **MUST** be used. See the NAFAS Guide to Mechanics for ideas on alternative methods to use.
- 6.3. Competitors may set up their Eco-friendly flower arranging support material/mechanics in position prior to the one-hour practical session if required.
- 6.4. Competitors are able to set up their display bay before the one-hour practical session commences.

7. MARKS

If a very high number of entries are received, on the day of the NFYFC final, the NFYFC reserves the right to use the NFYFC 'Standards Judging' system. i.e exhibits will be in the Excellent, Proficient or Competent categories.

- 10. **NAFAS Definitions** (The National Association of Flower Arranging Societies of Great Britain) From the NAFAS Competitions Manual (Fourth Edition 2023).
 - 10.0. An EXHIBIT:
 - 10.0.1.Is composed of natural plant material in all its forms, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule.
 - 10.0.2. Accessories need to go in front of backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics may always be included in an exhibit, unless otherwise stated.
 - 10.0.3. More than one placement may always be included, unless otherwise stated.
 - 10.0.4.In all exhibits natural plant material must predominate. Plant material must now predominate in all Still Life Exhibits

10.1. NATURAL PLANT MATERIAL

- 10.1.1.Natural plant material is any vegetable matter
- 10.1.2.It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild, foliage, fungi, vegetables and seaweed or made-up plant material.
- 10.1.3.It is acceptable to enhance plant material by the application of oil, milk, wax, leaf shine or other similar products.

10.2. ARTIFICAL PLANT MATERIAL

- 10.2.1.Artificial plant material is realistic or fantasy plant-forms, made wholly or partly from non-plant material.

 This includes, clay, glass, metal, plastic, plaster, polyester, shells, silk, wax, etc. This also includes fabric and ribbon made from a non-plant source, which is used as a substitute for natural plant material in an exhibit.
- 10.2.2. Artificial plant material **is not allowed** unless specifically permitted in a show schedule (see reasons for disqualification).
- 10.2.3. Artificial plant material or artificial plant forms that are an integral part of a container, base, background or accessory are permitted.
- 10.2.4. Artificial grass turf must not be used for any purpose including bases.

10.3. An ACCESSORY

- 10.3.1.Anything other than natural plant material in an exhibit, such as, feathers, shells, stones, wax candles
- 10.3.2. The following are not accessories and may also be used unless prohibited by the show schedule: backgrounds, bases, containers holding plant material, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics. These may be

decorated in any way but greater credit should be given for use of natural plant material where appropriate.

10.4. REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATION

- 10.4.1. Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, i.e. the measurements or the components. (Just remember it is better to aim to be at least several cms smaller than the size allowed as the size stated is the MAXIMUM size).
- 10.4.2.Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed by a show schedule)
- 10.4.3.Inclusion of fresh plant material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material. Exceptions: Air Plants, Cacti, Fruits, Grass Turf, Lichen, Moss, Succulents, Vegetables and long lasting plant material which will remain turgid for the duration of a show. (Definition of turgid the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE DISQUALIFICATION: the term used when an exhibit does not comply with the requirements of the schedule – see NAFAS reasons for disqualification above. The judge will write 'Not according to schedule' and the reason.

1. DATE AND VENUE

1.1. After Area Finals, the National Final will be held on Competitions Day, Saturday 6th July 2024 at Staffordshire Showground.

2. **REPRESENTATION**

- 2.1. Counties may enter one team per 600 members or part thereof in Area Finals.
- 2.2. Areas will be represented in the final by one team per 3,000 members or part thereof. (Northern Area 2, Eastern Area 1 and East Midlands 1, West Midlands Area 1, South West Area 2, South East Area 1 and Wales 2)

3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1. A team shall consist of **three (3)** members, each of whom must be 14 years of age or under on 1st September 2023 and full members of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC.

4. SUBSTITUTION

- 5.4. A draw will be made for the order of appearance prior to the competition.
- 5.5. All teams will be held in the preparation room until it is their turn to compete to avoid an unfair advantage as all teams are reading the same text. Therefore, competitors and their trainer will not be allowed into the room where the competition is taking place before competing.

To note that Power Point may be used as a visual aid for the Speaker, but they are not to be used for the whole speech and can only be used to enhance the speech. I.e. this is **NOT** a business presentation competition.
 - 5.3.2. The Speaker, who will be the guest of another team, will choose his/her own subject. The Speaker will then answer a question put by the Proposer of Vote of thanks and then a question from the judging panel. There is to be no questions asked from the floor/audience. A total of two questions will be asked.
 - 5.3.3. The chairman will invite the judges to put one question to the speaker who will then respond.

- 5.3.4. The Proposer will be seated in the body of the hall. He/she will take up some point in the Speaker's address, comment, agree or disagree and ask one pertinent question on the subject matter of the address. He/she will give the Vote of Thanks to the Speaker after all questions have been dealt with.
- 5.4. No communication, written or verbal between any of the team members, or the audience, will be permitted, and to do so will result in **immediate disqualification**.
- 5.5. Competitors may take notes FOR REFERENCE on to the platform as long as these notes are written on POSTCARDS. However, excessive, and obvious use of notes will be penalised. - 4.2.2. The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

- 4.2.3. Exhibit is to be viewed from all sides. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards MUST complement the theme and be neat and tidy.
- 4.2.4. At the national finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

4.3. **21 & Under**

- 4.3.1. Exhibit Title: "Door Wreath" A Front Facing Exhibit to the theme Christmas.
- 4.3.2. The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.
- 4.3.3. Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards MUST complement the theme and be neat and tidy.
- 4.3.4. At the national finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

4.4. **28 & Under**

- 4.4.1. **Exhibit** Title: "Bouquet" viewed from all sides to theme Christmas.
- 4.4.2. The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.
- 4.4.3. Exhibit is to be viewed from all sides no backboards allowed.
- 4.4.4. At the national finals, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

5. **DISPLAY**

- 5.1. A worktable will be provided close to the display area approx half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor.
- 5.2. Each exhibit will be displayed to their best advantage with the space allocation.
- 5.3. All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitors and must be assembled in the hall.
- 5.4. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards, under penalty of instant disqualification. No other person, other than the competitors, will be allowed in the competing area.
- 5.5. At the NFYFC final, the NFYFC will provide a County Name and Number label for each display and workspace.
- 5.6. Competitors may use a battery-operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will no mains power supply available
- 5.7. Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the back board or base board (i.e. the thickness of the backboard will be included in the size restrictions). Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the back board or base board will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit and should be within the size restrictions. The external side of the back board will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit.
- 5.8. Exhibits must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. Any entry removed before the Presentation of Awards will be disqualified.
- 5.9. All exhibits and competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and NFYFC cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value.

6. **TIMING**

- 6.0. Allowance of **one hour to include final checks and measurement of the exhibit**. Before leaving the competing area, competitors will be given a further 5 minutes to clear and tidy the work site.
- 6.1. Competitors may unpack their equipment and plant material/flowers onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session commences.
- 6.2. No floral foam is allowed Eco friendly alternatives **MUST** be used. See the NAFAS Guide to Mechanics for ideas on alternative methods to use.
- 6.3. Competitors may set up their Eco-friendly flower arranging support material/mechanics in position prior to the one-hour practical session if required.
- 6.4. Competitors are able to set up their display bay before the one-hour practical session commences.

7. MARKS

If a very high number of entries are received, on the day of the NFYFC final, the NFYFC reserves the right to use the NFYFC 'Standards Judging' system. i.e exhibits will be in the Excellent, Proficient or Competent categories.

8. AWARDS

- 8.0. 16 & under Lady Northcliffe Cup and Prize Card will be awarded to competitors placed 1st
- 8.1. 21 & under Millers' Mutual Cup and Prize Card will be awarded to competitors placed 1st
- 8.2. **26 & under** *London Flowers Perpetual Challenge Trophy* and Prize Card will be awarded to competitors placed 1st
- 8.3. NFYFC Prize Cards will be awarded to competitors placed 2nd and 3rd in each section.
- 8.4. NFYFC Certificate of Achievement will be awarded to competitors placed $1^{st} 10^{th}$ in each section.

9. **NOTES:**

- 9.0. Competitors to note that all buckets will be checked by Stewards on arrival for pre-arranged foliage
- 9.1. Competitors must not bring photographs/diagrams of previously arranged Floral Exhibits into the competing arena. Any competitor found doing so may be disqualified.
- 9.2. Competitors must wear white coats during the period of the competition. Club, County and Sponsor logos are permitted on either the front or the back of the coats.
- 9.3. A "Competitions Manual" is available from NAFAS Enterprises Ltd. <u>www.nafas.org.uk</u>
- 9.4. ALL EXHIBITS WILL BE JUDGED STRICTLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NAFAS COMPETITIONS MANUAL 2023. A "Competitions Manual" is available from www.nafas.org.uk to visit the NAFAS on-line shop.
- 10. **NAFAS Definitions** (The National Association of Flower Arranging Societies of Great Britain) From the NAFAS Competitions Manual (Fourth Edition 2023).
 - 10.0. An EXHIBIT:
 - 10.0.1.Is composed of natural plant material in all its forms, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule.
 - 10.0.2. Accessories need to go in front of backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics may always be included in an exhibit, unless otherwise stated.
 - 10.0.3. More than one placement may always be included, unless otherwise stated.
 - 10.0.4.In all exhibits natural plant material must predominate. Plant material must now predominate in all Still Life Exhibits

10.1. NATURAL PLANT MATERIAL

- 10.1.1.Natural plant material is any vegetable matter
- 10.1.2.It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild, foliage, fungi, vegetables and seaweed or made-up plant material.
- 10.1.3.It is acceptable to enhance plant material by the application of oil, milk, wax, leaf shine or other similar products.

10.2. ARTIFICAL PLANT MATERIAL

- 10.2.1.Artificial plant material is realistic or fantasy plant-forms, made wholly or partly from non-plant material.

 This includes, clay, glass, metal, plastic, plaster, polyester, shells, silk, wax, etc. This also includes fabric and ribbon made from a non-plant source, which is used as a substitute for natural plant material in an exhibit.
- 10.2.2. Artificial plant material **is not allowed** unless specifically permitted in a show schedule (see reasons for disqualification).
- 10.2.3. Artificial plant material or artificial plant forms that are an integral part of a container, base, background or accessory are permitted.
- 10.2.4. Artificial grass turf must not be used for any purpose including bases.

10.3. An ACCESSORY

- 10.3.1.Anything other than natural plant material in an exhibit, such as, feathers, shells, stones, wax candles
- 10.3.2. The following are not accessories and may also be used unless prohibited by the show schedule: backgrounds, bases, containers holding plant material, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics. These may be

decorated in any way but greater credit should be given for use of natural plant material where appropriate.

10.4. REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATION

- 10.4.1. Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, i.e. the measurements or the components. (Just remember it is better to aim to be at least several cms smaller than the size allowed as the size stated is the MAXIMUM size).
- 10.4.2.Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed by a show schedule)
- 10.4.3.Inclusion of fresh plant material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material. Exceptions: Air Plants, Cacti, Fruits, Grass Turf, Lichen, Moss, Succulents, Vegetables and long lasting plant material which will remain turgid for the duration of a show. (Definition of turgid the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE DISQUALIFICATION: the term used when an exhibit does not comply with the requirements of the schedule – see NAFAS reasons for disqualification above. The judge will write 'Not according to schedule' and the reason.
